

# Review May 2023 - April 2024

#### **Our Purpose**

The National Heritage Science Forum works to demonstrate the relevance of heritage science in the UK. It is a focus point for collaboration, knowledge exchange, and partnerships, working to make heritage science better connected to the needs of society.

### **Our 2023-24 Strategic Priorities**

Each year our Trustees identify strategic priorities for the year ahead, in consultation with our Member Council. These align with the Strategic Framework for Heritage Science in the UK, 2018-2023, which can be found here.

- A. A successor to the Strategic Framework for Heritage Science in the UK, 2018-2023 is developed.
- B. UKRI and AHRC are provided with sector data and insight to support investment in, and successful launch of the Research Infrastructure for Conservation and Heritage Science (RICHeS).
- C. The broad relevance and importance of heritage science is well articulated, demonstrating how heritage science helps to address the issues that matter to people.
- D. A vibrant and sustainable NHSF is able to champion heritage science and support its members.

## Our 2023-24 Progress

- A. A successor to the Strategic Framework for Heritage Science in the UK, 2018-2023 is developed.
- The NHSF Working Groups and Member Council **reviewed the 2018-2023 Strategic Framework**; proposed draft changes; and considered progress, opportunities and challenges for each strategic outcome.
- Consultation with the heritage science community will begin later in 2024.

#### B. UKRI and AHRC are provided with sector data and insight to support investment in, and successful launch of RICHeS.

- Held a <u>Digital Society 'Deep Dive' meeting</u> to examine challenges, solutions, and future developments for UK heritage science digital infrastructure. AHRC provided an update on the Digital Research Services branch of RICHeS.
- NHSF Trustee joined the RICHeS Project Board.
- Contributed to RICHeS Gateway 2 and Gateway 3 reviews.
- Contributed to the evaluation of the strategic importance of AHRC's World Class Labs portfolio.
- Contributed to the Council for Science and Technology (CST) Roundtable on Research & Development in the UK Creative Industries.

#### C. The broad relevance and importance of heritage science is well articulated, demonstrating how heritage science helps to address the issues that matter to people.

- Published **briefing notes** on: Scotland's Museums & Galleries Strategy, the NLHF's 'Heritage 2033', and the Culture and Heritage Capital Programme.
- Conducted a survey on impact data collection methods and audiences.
- Published 5 general case studies (originally produced for AHRC) and 1 societal challenge case study on the NHSF website to evidence the value of heritage science.
- Ran a <u>Climate Emergency 'Deep Dive' event</u> to discuss how the heritage science sector is helping to address the climate emergency, and opportunities for future research. The event was followed by 6 weeks of online discussion groups. The NHSF will publish a series of blog posts based on the event's presentations.
- Participated in a **focus group** to help shape recommendations to the Welsh government on tackling climate change and nature emergencies.
- Contributed to a **consultation on operating sustainable archaeological archives** as part of Historic England's Future for Archaeological Archives Programme.
- Hosted an **Equality, Diversity and Inclusion workshop** for members.
- Trustee presented on NHSF and RICHeS at a Royal Microscopical Society EM-UKI event to **raise awareness of heritage science** amongst the electron microscopy community.

## D. A vibrant and sustainable NHSF is able to champion heritage science and support its members.

- Appointed the **new Board Chair**, Prof Chris Gaffney, in January 2024.
- Ran the NHSF mentoring programme for students and early-career professionals.
- Provided Letters of Support to member organisations for RICHeS bids.
- Welcomed **three new NHSF members**: the Science Museum Group, the British Library, and the University of Reading.
- Commissioned a **communications resource** to support NHSF in communicating what heritage science is and why it matters.
- Ran an NHSF **newsletter survey** to improve our offering to subscribers.
- Launched the <u>NHSF LinkedIn page</u> in February 2024, which has since gained over 225 followers.
